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

ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL:

Breakfast- 7:40-8:00am

- All students enter via EXIT 4

School Day 8:00am-2:45pm

- 3K-PK: Arrival & Dismissal parents drop off and & up students at their classroom.
- K-1: Students enter & exit through EXIT 5 (Auditorium) Staff will escort students.
- 2-5: Students enter & exit through EXIT 4 (139th St. near Flag Pole)

Additional Information

- Please do not send your child to school before 7:40 AM. There is no staff supervision before 7:40 am.
- All students arriving after 8:00am must enter through the main entrance.
- Dismissal begins promptly at 2:45 P.M. Monday thru Friday, doors open at 2:40pm.
- Please pick up your child on time at 2:45 pm.



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- Any student not picked up on time will be escorted to the Auditorium by their classroom teacher.
- Please avoid double parking as it can prevent buses from picking up student

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance Goal

- Our Attendance Goal this school year is **92.5%**. This means on average our students miss less than 8% of school, **13 days or less is considered to meet our goal**.

Absences & Lateness

- **SCHOOL BEGINS PROMPTLY AT 8:00 a.m.** Good attendance is directly related to students' school performance. Tardiness is disruptive to a student's daily schedule and can impact both the student and their peers; which impacts the learning process. All children should be in attendance and on time each day unless they are ill. We also ask that early pick-ups are kept to a minimum, as they also result in loss of instructional time. Should you ever need attendance support, please contact the school's attendance team.

Absence Reporting

- All planned absences need to be communicated with both the classroom teacher and the main office.
- If there is an unplanned absence, we ask that you call the school before 9:00am. If we do not hear from you, our attendance team will reach out to you.
- Upon return from an absence, a letter where appropriate should be provided. (i.e. a doctor's note)
- For students on an extended absence, the Pupil Accounting Secretary will require evidence of the planned absence. (i.e. airline tickets)
- If we do not have communication with a family for more than two days, and in an effort to ensure your family's well-being, we will ask our Attendance Teacher to conduct further outreach, which may include a home visit.

SCHOOL VISITOR POLICY:

ANY VISITOR TO THE BUILDING MUST STOP AT THE SECURITY DESK AND SIGN IN AND THEN BE DIRECTED TO (Room 116 Main Office)

- All approved visitors must keep their visitor pass visible at all times to ensure student and staff safety.
- Visitors should not visit other classrooms or offices without authorization.
- Visitors should utilize adult bathrooms only.

Parent Contact Information: VERY IMPORTANT

The office must be advised immediately of any changes in phone numbers, email addresses, or physical addresses for parents, guardians, or **emergency contacts**. It is vitally important that we be able to reach parents when necessary. Please include work, home, and cell phone numbers if applicable.

Emergency Card: You must have this on file with us

- This is a legal document.
- EMERGENCY CARDS must be filled out completely and returned to school as soon as possible.
- We can only call those names listed on the cards.
- A child will not be released to anyone who is not listed on the card, does not have the proper identification, or is under the age of 18.



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List as many names as possible. If a babysitter, private bus or other service picks up your child his/her name and phone number must be on the card.

Please notify the school's Pupil Accounting Secretary or main office staff immediately of any changes on the card (i.e. change of address, phone #'s & emergency contacts). It is extremely important that the school can reach you at one of the phone #'s you have listed. Also, remember to list all cell phone #'s, and email addresses.

EMERGENCY DRILLS:

- Evacuation drills, shelter drills and soft lockdowns are conducted throughout the year.
- Children are taught the proper procedures and signals to follow to ensure their safety.
- In the event of emergency situations the Principal and staff will follow the procedures outlined in our N.Y.C.P.D. approved School Safety Plan.
- Communication will be sent out via email on file, a call to your number, Class Dojo or a combination of those options.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR:

- P.S. 179 is a Conflict Resolution school.
- Respect and courtesy are vital elements in working together at P.S. 179.
- In the early part of each school year the Chancellor sends out the Discipline Code from the NYC Department of Education which is sent home. We ask that you review it with your child.
- All students must adhere to the Discipline Code. Students who disobey the regulations and codes will be issued the appropriate consequences and interventions.



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- Respect for adults and peers are important concepts taught at school. Following school rules is a critical element in keeping our school calm and orderly. A positive attitude and cooperation goes a long way. We ask for your support in having 100% compliance

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES AND BEHAVIOR:

One of the most important lessons education should teach is how to build a positive school climate. While it does not appear as a subject, it underlies the whole educational structure. To insure the rights of each student to attend school in a safe, positive environment, it is the student's responsibility to:

- Come to school everyday- **Presence is key**
- Take care of books, technology, materials, desks and the school building
- Be respectful of the property of others
- Be kind and helpful to staff and other students
- Refrain from bullying and or peer conflict that is harmful to another student
- Be truthful and honest at all times- **Demonstrate Integrity**
- Use language that is not offensive to anyone
- Never get involved in a physical exchange- **Keep your hands to yourself**

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REPORT CARDS:

Similar to the NYS grade reporting, the academic performance levels of 1 to 4 indicate how students have met the expectations set by the current standards. Kindergarten through fifth grade will use the 1-4 grading system.
